Through our initiatives, we offer essential resources such as school supplies, scholarships, solar lights (enabling children to study after dark), mosquito nets (protecting them from malaria), and computer/vocational training. These provisions aim to empower individuals, enabling them to achieve self-sufficiency and transcend the poverty cycle.

By strengthening individuals and families, we believe in catalyzing contributions to community, national, and global advancement. Together, these empowered individuals form the bedrock of progress, actively shaping positive change on local and international scales.

School Support Distribution

In 2023, 142 children from nursery school through Senior Secondary School from Bo, Kamawornie, Makeni, and Freetown received comprehensive school support, ensuring they had access to quality education. The support included the provision of essential items such as books, school supplies, and tuition assistance.





61 Drums full of books, teacher supplies, electronics, and school supplies were shipped to Sierra Leone in 2023. The drums were filled with donated school supplies from around the world.







3 students received vocational training support covering their school fees for the 2022-2023 academic year.

In the 2022-2023 school year, Develop Africa provided support for the WASSCE exam to 8 students. The West African Senior School Certificate Examination (WASSCE) is a standardized test for senior secondary school students in West Africa.

This assistance ensures that these older students, upon successful completion of the exam, have the opportunity to advance to higher education or pursue other career paths.

11 students received college tuition support for the 2022- 2023 school year.







Child Sponsorship Program

Child sponsorship is **the best way to impact or change a life in Africa** and bring hope to the entire community. When individuals and families are strengthened, they can contribute toward sustainable development in their communities and Africa.



Sponsoring a child provides the continuity of impact that is needed - impacting the growth and development of children. The critical area of empowerment that we focus on is education. When you sponsor a child, your funds support your child's education. Providing educational support is a tested and proven way to impact lives by providing the vital knowledge and skills that the child needs to grow up, become independent and self-sufficient, and contribute to their community and national and global development.





In 2023, there were 95 child sponsorships. These sponsors and sponsored children exchanged photos, letters, and videos. Sometimes, the sponsors sent additional care packages or support. One sponsor even traveled to Sierra Leone to meet her sponsored child.

The goal of interest-free microfinance loans is to provide parents/guardians with the ability to support their families. Mariatu sells fries/snacks and candies at a primary school in her community. Through her business, she can support her kids, and two of her kids are part of the sponsorship program.

Thanks in part to your support, more children and young adults are getting the computer training they need for success in today's technology-driven environment. Hawa & Mohamed are two of the students who recently received a certificate of completion for Intro to Computers and Microsoft Office- Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel, Microsoft PowerPoint/Presentation, Microsoft Publisher, Microsoft Access/Database, and Microsoft Internet Browser.

Empowering Futures Through Computer Training



Impact Assessment Report

In 2023, impact assessments were conducted in Freetown and Bo, respectively, with the aim of measuring progress toward achieving the project goal by evaluating key project objectives. The assessments unveiled noteworthy advancements in reaching the project goals.

Project's objective

Granting scholarship assistance for the payment of school fees and provision of learning materials to less privileged children and community schools.

Enhancing the well-being of vulnerable and underprivileged children in deprived communities.

Advocating for and advancing primary education for vulnerable and underprivileged children in deprived communities.

Promoting the education of girls within their communities, thereby mitigating the high rate of illiteracy among girls.











2022/2023 Boys and Girls Mentoring Evaluation

A questionnaire specifically tailored to address project objectives was developed, and data were gathered from beneficiaries aged 18 and older, or from the parents/guardians of beneficiaries below 18 years of age.

Monthly Beneficiary Mentoring - Freetown Beneficiaries

Between January 2022 and March 2023, a series of nine mentoring sessions were organized for sixty beneficiaries (35 boys and 25 girls) enrolled in the child scholarship program. The sessions covered diverse topics aimed at fostering the personal and educational development of the beneficiaries. Evaluation questions centered around the impact of various discussion topics, the effectiveness of guest speakers' deliverables, and the attributes of the mentoring facilitators.

Analysis of fifty-four questionnaires revealed that the mentoring program had a positive impact on the lives of at least fifty (50) mentees. The table below provides details of the questions asked and the corresponding responses:
